Most organisations are based at sites that have various working zones and typically these can include offices, shared areas, manufacturing, distribution, yards and parking. Each of these areas will have it's own unique safety issues and safety signage requirements.

This Audit tool has been designed to help you take a walk around your premises and identify any safety signage that requires updating or may be missing.

IT'S THE LAW!

It's a legal requirement for all businesses to ensure they have health and safety signage that is clear and legible.

Signage is designed to help people identify hazards, provides safety information and identifies safe routes / access around buildings, keeping employees and members of the public safe.

The Health & Safety Executive (HSE) state that "safety signs should be used where there is a significant risk to health and safety that has not been removed or controlled by other methods". Safety signs cover various situations, they need to be the correct size to ensure viewing at distance and have the latest BS EN ISO7010 symbols.

WHAT DO THE COLOURS OF DIFFERENT SIGNS MEAN?

Health and Safety signs can be broken down into the following categories, as specified by British and European standards.



Mandatory Signs

A blue circle containing a white image denoting that a specific course of action must be taken.



Safety helmets must be worn in this area



Hazard Warning Signs

A yellow triangle with a black border and symbol denoting a hazard in the environment.



Fire assembly point

Danger 440 volts



Prohibition Signs

A red circular band with a diagonal bar on a white background. The black symbol behind indicates the prohibited action.



No smoking



Fire Equipment

A red rectangle or square with a symbol or text in white providing information about the location and use of fire fighting equipment.

1: ARE YOUR ISO SYMBOLS CORRECT?



The BS ISO 7010 regulation ensures that all graphical safety symbols are consistent and compliant. It is a design directive and is a list of compliant symbols. If any of your signs feature the old symbols, these signs should be updated to be in-line with regulations.

CAR PARK SIGNAGE, SPEED RESTRICTIONS

- Do visitors know how to get to the reception/goods in/car park etc?
- Are there any areas outside the building that are strictly no parking & are they clearly marked?

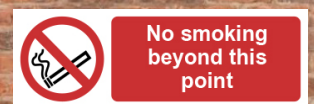
- Can the roof and skylights hold the weight of an average human?

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8: FIRST AID

Under the Health and Safety (First Aid) Regulations 1981 (as amended 1997) employers have a legal obligation to assess and introduce first aid provisions. Any such provision should be easy to locate in the event of an emergency.

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10: SIGNS FOR VISITORS



- Can visitors easily locate toilets?
- Are hot water tanks/ taps clearly marked if they can reach a harmful temperature?
- Do 'wash hands' signs currently appear in washrooms?
- Are lights turned off automatically when someone leaves the washroom? If not is a sign required?
- Are toilets inspected regularly and a cleaning program in place?
- Are customers, visitors and staff aware of areas they are restricted from entering?
- Are there any unexpected trip hazards, changes in floor levels or overhead obstacles?
- Is PPE required before entering specific areas of the building?
- Do people with a visual impairment visit your business? If so, is there appropriate Braille signage in place?

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11: OFFICE AREAS GENERAL

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13: FIRE EXIT SIGNAGE



- Is there a fire exit sign with an arrow pointing upwards above each fire door? (Arrows should not point left or right if positioned above a door)
- Except for an office with one door out of it, can a fire exit sign be clearly seen from everywhere in the building?
- Do all fire exit signs show a running man and accompanying text?
- Have you replaced exit signs displaying the old EC Directive designs?
- Would fire exit signs be visible in the event of a power failure or through smoke?
- Is the direction of the fire escape route clearly indicated (up or down the stairs)?
- Do the stair treads and handrails have contrasting colours to highlight edges to the visually impaired? Would this contrast be visible in the event of a power failure?
- Do you have measures in place for the safe evacuation of wheelchair users and / or visually impaired people in the event of an emergency?
- Are your fire exit signs clearly visible or old and faded
- Do your fire doors feature a notice to keep fire doors shut?
